This year the word of focus for our ministry has been Hope. What is HOPE? What a great question for today. Many put hope in a variety of things, systems, resources, leadership, or relationships. The source of a person's hope determines if the hope is a long-term hope or a temporary hope, and I think every person longs for a Hope that is stationary, unwavering, consistent, long lasting, and ultimately eternal. If we find that kind of source for our hope, then we could find stability in the ebb and flow of life. It would

be available always, no matter the circumstances.

The definition of hope depending on how the word is being used is – 1. a feeling of expectation and desire for a certain thing to happen and 2. It is a feeling of trust. Both uses of the word can go hand in hand for what we as humans Hope for: something that we can trust in for a future desired expectation to happen. The source of our Hope, or we could say what we hope in, will determine the confidence level of our expectation in a certain thing to happen, and to put these two definitions for Hope together in another way, we could say: Do I trust the source of my hope to give me confidence that a certain thing will happen?

Among all the things people may hope for when it comes down to it, everyone desires one common thing: A conqueror for all and any circumstance. Everyone desires healing from brokenness, diseases to be cured, depression to become happiness, for no pain, for peace, for everlasting joy, and if this is accurate, then the question is: What Source produces this Hope? What source can be trustworthy and faithful to fulfill this longing of humanity? What source can be constant in any culture at any time and against any opposition?

The answer is Jesus! Jesus is the ONLY Hope that can fulfill this longing. He is the only source available. Nothing else can produce this surety in life's deepest longing. ONLY Christ, and He is enough! It's not the idea of Christianity that produces hope. It's not the idea of salvation that produces this kind of hope. It's not the Bible alone that produces this kind of hope. Its plainly Jesus. He is the ultimate source of Hope. It is the Supremacy of our Savior! It is His life lived, His work accomplished on and through the cross, His sitting at the right hand of the Father actively now, and His Future promised return that fuels our Hope. Without Him there is NO hope.

The Bible says in Hebrews 10:23 ***“Let us hold fast the confessions of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful.”*** What is the confession of our Hope that we are to hold to without wavering? Hope is not the same as wishful thinking; it is based on a person. Our confession is simply stated in 3 words: Jesus is Lord! Jesus is what we hold fast to without wavering, and the reason this is sustainable for all of life and eternity is because ***He who promised is Faithful!*** Because of the Faithfulness of God, we can trust the source of our hope, Jesus Christ! The desire of our staff is to hold fast to Jesus as Lord, to know Him so deeply that we are not easily shaken when the unexpected things of life and ministry happen, and to share this Hope with others to supply a cornerstone of stability in their lives through belief in Jesus that is unwavering! 2025 was another exciting year!!!! We had 2 people, dad and son, who excepted Christ this year in the Porch. Salvations often occur outside the building due to mission team efforts. The team's pastor celebrated these 2 with us, and we were delighted to spend extra time with them. Repairs, Repairs, and Repairs. A building that is 105 years old always needs a little extra love and care. We were able to add 2 new water heaters this year, and we have one more already donated to install. Hopefully in 2026, we will be able to work more on the outside of the building and remodel the 4th floor.

This year we had 46 teams, 15 of those teams were new teams making 1038 people that stayed at Solomon's Porch. 11 states were represented Kentucky, N. Carolina, Texas, Tennessee, Florida, Virginia, Georgia, Alabama, S Carolina, Indiana, and Arkansas. We already have 31 teams signed up for 2026. June and July are almost full. We do have some sad news for next year's teams. Lydia's House, the addiction recovery center for women in Benham has closed. We thank each team that went to the center to minister to the ladies. Your love helped them grow in so many ways. From 2019 until closure, 414 ladies accepted Christ and were baptized. We will miss Lydia's House, but we are excited to see what God opens to us in their absence.

Hope House

The Hope House and ministries conducted there have seen many changes over the last year. The closing of Lydia's House is the most significant. The attendance at Celebrate Recovery and AA have decreased, but we are resilient to the vision. Ministering to those ladies over the last 9 years has been a blessing and fruitful; 414 baptisms since 2019. However, the community impact of those programs has always struggled. Lydia's House both trained us and gave us a heart for folks in addiction and recovery. Now we see God transitioning us, so that our whole focus is on reaching residents of this valley.

On Mondays, hot meals are being served at HH. The concerns over the government shut down, the delay of food stamps, and the oncoming winter, has caused an increase in demand for these meals. Some Mondays have seen over 100 meals distributed. Christ's Hands in Harlan has been providing about 40 meals. Volunteers have been cooking extra soups in their homes to compensate for the additional need. In recent days, we've expanded the "Soup Kitchen" to serving hot meals on Wednesdays at noon as well. Recently, we applied for a Frazier Foundation Grant and was awarded \$5000 to build a kitchen. We will be able to cook meals on the grounds now. Praise the Lord!!!

Three different church teams replaced and repaired a large portion of the floor. A future project would be finishing the floor replacement. Once the floors are leveled and reinforced, the goal is to stud and insulate the walls. We are so thankful to see God providing and using this old building for His glory. Women's Bible Studies continue, and Men's prayer gatherings have also taken place at Hope House.

It has been a blessing to watch and see the effects not only for our neighbors, but on our own hearts as well.

Ivan had the opportunity to fill the pulpit in several different churches and to speak with the FCA at Midway University in Midway, KY. Julie helped to facilitate a ladies bible study through Arise (an organization she has been involved with for several years now) and continues to serve with leadership with Celebrate Recovery.

We were able to see family several times throughout the year - Ivan to see his family in Kansas and help his mom as she continues to rehabilitate from her car accident in 2024. She has continued to inspire and share the gospel with others throughout her lengthy recovery, and we were so thankful to see her and her husband move back into their own home again this year. We were able to see family back home in Virginia as well – and we welcomed grandson #2 in February and our first granddaughter in October!

Julie underwent rotator cuff surgery in June this year – not an ideal time, but God worked out all the details in a nothing short of miraculous way, and she is doing well now. We are both thankful to Tracy and Jennifer, and our Meridzo and Dione Baptist church families for stepping in to help while she was down for a couple of months.

We are grateful for this season of quiet before the new year begins and are looking forward to what 2026 brings!

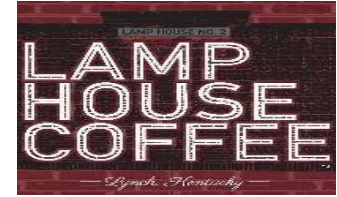

As many of you know, the Center for Worship has been without a functional roof for years. Technically, it has a roof – but one that lets in more rain than it keeps out. 2025 has seen so many good things for Calvary Campus! 14 teams came through this year, with 3 brand new teams, and lots of returning friends and ministry partners. These teams accomplished many projects, including prayer walks, VBS, deck repairs, and lawncare and yardwork both on campus and in the community.

Some exciting new things happened on campus this year as well, such as the reintroduction of the locally sponsored Antique Show hosted in Calvary Campus's gymnasium. Both the Spring and Fall shows were very well attended by vendors and shoppers alike and featured many local artists, as well as, a food truck from Cane's Kitchen. Be on the lookout for the next Spring show coming up in April 2026!

Calvary Campus is also working on some new renovations and additions to its facility, one of the most exciting being its very own honey extraction room! Calvary's hives have been producing very well over the past several years, this year being our highest production year so far with our 6 hives producing 9 five-gallon buckets – that's 45 gallons of honey! We are currently working to turn a couple of rooms in the basement of the gym into an extraction and bottling facility, so that our entire process from start to finish can be done in-house.

Calvary's food pantry has also been very active this year, currently serving 58 families on the south end of Letcher County. We have seen an increase in need in this area, as grocery store prices continue to rise. We currently have a waiting list of folks seeking food box assistance and are working diligently to meet the needs of the community as God provides. If you would like to assist Calvary's food pantry, please pray with us for God's provision and guidance in the best way to meet the needs of our neighbors and friends. We know that our food boxes, while meeting a very important physical need, are only tools that have been given to us to reach the true spiritual need of a personal relationship with God through Christ Jesus.

We praise God for His faithful and merciful kindness this past year, as we have seen through Calvary's ministry and in our family the way God loves and provides for His children. His sustaining strength and grace has met us in every valley and on every mountain top we have traveled through this year. Of the many quotes my father Marc taught us throughout our lives, two stand out this year in particular; "We get a front row seat to see God at work every day" and "Blessed are the flexible, for they shall not break". While continuing to serve at Calvary Campus has been extremely hard to do without my father's guidance, my Heavenly Father has never failed to catch me at every stumble, provide for me at every turn, and love me with every fault. 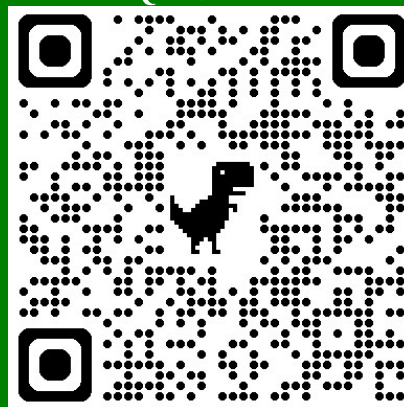
